### **WILDWOOD DETAILS**

Wildwood Elementary School serves children from Kindergarten through fifth grade. There are thirty-two classrooms, including two three full day Kindergarten sections.

- Full-time Fine Arts (Art, Music, & P.E.) teachers provide instruction to students in all-day Kindergarten and 1st through 5th grades. Each student receives 45 minutes each day in one of these three subject areas. Wildwood also has a librarian who provides training for students in literature, library use, research, and technology.
- Wildwood provides special education services to meet the needs of students in an inclusive environment. Teams of special education teachers and regular education teachers serve students with identified special needs. Outside counseling agencies provide counseling to students. A nurse provides medical attention to students who need it.
- An Intervention Assistance Team (IAT) works to support students who are having difficulties in the classroom. Students are referred to IAT by teachers and parents at which time the IAT convenes to learn more about the child and brainstorm strategies to help support their success in the classroom. Parental involvement is a very important piece throughout this process.
- Free breakfast program for all students
- Wildwood has a parent activity coordinator who plans four literacy activities a year involving parents and students.
- Wildwood is the home for all of the district's elementary ESL students. Parent's of our ESL students expressed an interest in helping their students with their studies, but they indicated that they need to learn English. We partnered with the district's Adult Education School to bring adult ESL instruction to Wildwood to serve our parents and ultimately better serve our families.
- Wildwood has a very active community volunteer program. Professional community members volunteer their time to tutor our students with academics as needed. The Parent Teacher Organization is very active, monthly skating parties, fundraisers, financial support for field trips, programs, and classrooms, as well as a host of other supports during the year.
