Winter Utility Assistance

Supports to Encourage Low-income Families (SELF), Butler County's community action agency, has begun taking appointments for the 2009 Winter Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) which officially begins Monday, Nov. 2. Last winter SELF assisted more than 3,700 households who were in danger of losing their utilities and heat, a record high for the agency. Customers with regulated utility providers may receive up to \$175 from the Emergency-Home Energy Assistance Program to prevent utility disconnection or restoration of services. SELF is asking for callers' patience as the agency expects to see an increased volume of calls each day.
