The Middletown City Health Department will hold an H1N1 influenza vaccination clinic on Tuesday, November 24th from 5:00-8:00 p.m. It will be held at Miami University Middletown in Johnston Hall. Signs will mark the building and parking. The clinic is open to all students, families and staff. There is no charge for the vaccination. At this time there are no plans to hold another clinic at Mayfield so if you want your child to be immunized against the H1N1 flu this is your opportunity to do so. **High risk students under age 9 that received their first shot at Mayfield may come to the clinic for their second shot.**
